This elusive loner's life centers on its den, from which it warily ventures to forage for nearby plants. Rarely seen by humans, its most recent confirmed sightings came after a disappearance

of 20 years. Now, faced with climate change, overgrazing by livestock and deadly encounters with dogs, the ili pika may be on the verge of disappearing altogether.
