


Tasmanian Devil (Sarcophilus harrisii)

A ferocious predator and opportunistic scavenger, the devil hunts alone and regularly ambushes prey larger than itself. Yet this uniquely formidable creature faces a unique threat: Devil Facial Tumor Disease, a fatal infectious form of cancer, has decimated

populations. Scientists and conservationists are alarmed by the all-too-likely possibility of the devil's total extinction in the wild. Unmatched today, unknown tomorrow?
