After aggressively chasing away interlopers, he welcomes a single female to his domain. This striking fish has always been in high demand for collections, but this demand is now largely being met

with captive-bred fish. However, climate change and related El Niño-Southern Oscillation (ENSO) events remain a serious threat to its life on the reef.
